Urgent call for Essex volunteers for Vaccination and Booster programme

Essex residents are being asked to volunteer as England's Covid-19 vaccination and booster programme is stepped up.

Community and health services are urgently looking for more volunteers in Essex to help with the Covid-19 vaccination and booster programme.

Residents are being asked to spare a few hours a week to join in on the huge national effort to protect more people against Covid-19.

In England, the Government has set a new target to give boosters to those who are eligible by the end of the month.

Volunteers will be asked to help in a range of tasks – like being a steward or providing administrative support - with shifts starting from four hours.
