The Community Policing Team encompasses the Town Centre Team. They undertake proactive and reactive policing tasks covering engagement, crime prevention, crime disruption, and safeguarding of vulnerable people. The teams have embedded specialist Missing Persons officers and Children's and Young Person officers, who work with partners in education and social care to protect vulnerable people from harm.

The Local Policing Team responds to calls for assistance from members of the public, undertake proactive overt patrols and focus, however, their main role is reactive policing.

We have a very clear focus on;

Violence – disrupting those who commit serious organised crime and to dismantle the supply of controlled drugs in the district. We will target those who carry knives and commit violence ensuring Maldon remains a safe place for all.

Vulnerability – we will ensure we engage with our communities to understand their needs and deliver policing to safeguard those who are vulnerable in our community.

Victims – we will provide victims with a first-class service.

Visibility – we will be visible in our communities to provide reassurance and reduce the fear of crime.



Maldon District Commander Message

Welcome to January's monthly newsletter, this month the team have concentrated on high visibility patrols in the Maldon District after reports of antisocial behaviour and drug supply. The team have also worked closely with Maldon District Council and Chelmsford City Council to provide joint patrols and we ran a bike marking event in South Woodham Ferrers on the 19th of January 2022 in partnership with the City Council. .

The Disruptor Team directed patrols in Heybridge after the team received complaints about drug supply and on the first night of patrolling they arrested a male who had a large quantity of drugs, this male was consequently arrested. We will continue to patrol the area and target those who are responsible for supplying illegal drugs.

The Community Safety Engagement Officers have been in Mayland, Heybridge, Bradwell and St Lawrence, to name a few, speaking to local residents and providing a high visibility presence within the Dengie. Our Town Team Officers are also patrolling Maldon High Street after we received reports of antisocial behaviour, so please continue to report any concerns you have so the team know which areas to target.

On the 19th of January the Chief Constable joined my officers on Maldon High Street to patrol and complete licensing checks at local pubs and bars.

During the month of February the Community Policing Team will be focussing on road safety awareness so please contact us with any speeding or road related concerns you have.

Essex Police - Maldon District

On 13th January 2022 the Community Safety Engagement Officers and Community Protection Officers from Maldon District Council conducted foot patrols in #Heybridge after reports of antisocial behaviour and illicit drug use.

Children leaving school were very interested in the Police car so the Officers gave them a tour and showed them the lights!

Following these reports an Operation was put together in order to focus a proactive policing presence in the Maldon and



Burnham area. Within the space of around three hours the team achieved the arrest of a male for possession with intend to supply a Class A drug. The male was also reported for driving without insurance and driving otherwise in accordance with a licence and will be further arrested as a result of an outstanding FTA warrant for historic driving offences.

Additionally to this, the team to the above the team also achieved a vehicle seizure, a second traffic report, a CR for possession of cannabis, several stop searches, and a number of PIRs.

A very productive operation brought about by the local community being proactive in reporting Anti Social Behaviour to the Police.





An additional 9 resources were provided and 22 emergencies and other incidents were attended.



Be mindful fraudsters

More and more people are choosing to send mail/ birthday cards/ Easter cards etc by email.

Cyber criminals are taking advantage of this trend and creating their own ecards which contain viruses (malware).

These viruses embed themselves into your electronic device and collect personal data, financial information, passwords and usernames, which can be used to commit fraud.

Protect yourself by not opening any anonymous e-cards and deleting them. Use an anti-virus product on your electronic device, making sure it's regularly updated and always turned on.

If you think your electronic device has been infected, switch it off and disconnect from the internet to prevent further information from being stolen.
