This month we have conducted numerous operations around the county where we have issued in excess of 20 traffic reports as well as seizing cars. DOG ENGAGEMENT DAYS

The team regularly conduct dog engagement days in which the officers offer advice to owners on protection and crime prevention of your beloved pets.

These engagement days have arrived as part of a force-wide effort supported by the Police and Fire Crime Commissioner's (PFCC) office to tackle the national problem of dog theft. Whilst we have been lucky in Essex to not have had many thefts of dogs it is something we are passionate about preventing.



The officers from the team will work with Community Policing Teams throughout the county to attend events, give displays and offer vital crime prevention advice. They will check the dogs for microchips to make



sure they have one which is a legal requirement. The microchip database is then checked to ensure the details are correct. It's important to update the details of the microchip if you change ownership, move house or get a new phone number. This is how we find out who the dog belongs to and how we'd return them should they ever be lost or stolen. All of our vehicles have microchip readers for this very reason.

BYWAY PATROLS

The team continue to patrol the byways of Essex. We have a large amount of byways in the county. These are ancient roads which people are free to enjoy either walking, cycling or in a vehicle. A common misconception is that you don't need to have insurance, MOT etc to use a vehicle on the byways. Always think, a Byway is a Highway and you can't go wrong. This means the same requirements are needed to drive on the byways as anywhere else. We patrol the byways as those who enjoy them want to test their vehicles which can make them stray onto neighbouring farm land damaging crops or drive in an antisocial manner. LOCATING STOLEN VEHICLES

We're fortunate on the team to have use of a wide range of technology for various different issues.

One piece of kit we have in our vehicles is Tracker. This is not fitted to just our vehicles but many across the force too. If you have a tracking device through the company Tracker, then our tracking system will locate the device. On this occasion a Range Rover (right) that had been recently stolen was located quickly to be returned to a happy owner. The



trackers can also be fitted to plant machinery or items such as generators etc.

We also use Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) to locate vehicles of interest to us. On the 17th



February we assisted our colleagues on the Roads Policing Unit (RPU) to locate the vehicle pictured (left). This van had been reported stolen, went through one of our ANPR cameras which enabled officers to stop the van and arrest it's two occupants.

Pleased to say the there are two happy owners being re-united with their vehicles.

WEEK OF ACTION

February saw the team take part in a national week of action to tackle cable theft. In Essex we have suffered with the theft of large telecoms cable from underground. We worked with BT who own the cable to inspect scrap metal sites around the county. The team took BT engineers with them so they could identify any cable as theirs and help us to identify any other metal that could be stolen. During the week of action the team also targeted vehicles carrying waste metal to check for waste carrier licences and where the metal had come from.

WARRANT EXECUTED

On the 22nd February the team assisted in executing multiple warrants in Essex, Cambridgeshire and Bedfordshire. The team assisted mainly in Chelmsford during which they found a number of dogs living in a poor conditionssome requiring vet treatment. We're all dog lovers on the team and a quick phone call to our contacts in the RSPCA and we had an Inspector on route. They too were appalled with the living standards of the dogs and the conditions they had to live in. The team acted quickly to locate the owner who will be dealt with by the RSPCA. The team seized 11 dogs who will now get the treatment they need and a new loving home.
