## RET AT THE DOE SHOW

In February the team spent three days at the Ernest Doe 'Doe Show 2024'.

The annual agricultural show, one of the biggest in Europe is held every year in Ulting, Maldon.


The team took along the wildlife and heritage crime trailer, packed with leaflets and useful information.



Over three days the trailer was visited by over 100 people, most linked to the farming community.

## MORE PROPERTY RECOVERED

The team have been busy scouring the county for stolen property.

In Chelmsford, the team located two stolen quad bikes taken during rural burglaries. They also located a stolen pick up truck in the same location.



The team also swung into action after a Maldon farmer reported one of his 12ft gates stolen. The gate was clearly marked with his post code and farm name.

In under 24 hours the team had located the gate already installed on a new building plot. Despite its size the gate was recovered and returned to its rightful



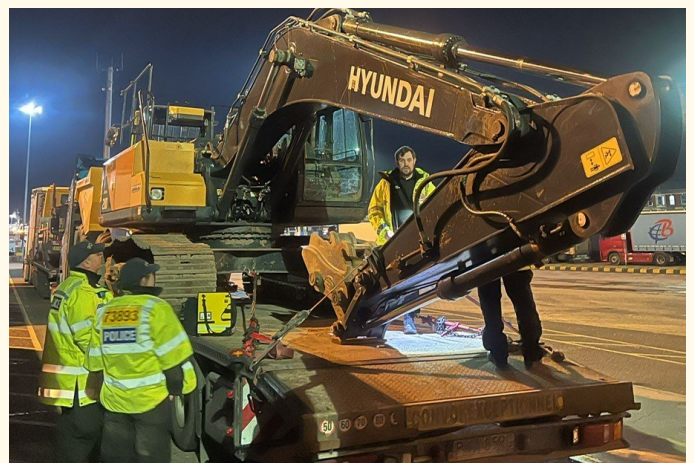
owner.

In Thurrock we tracked down a stolen Nissan pick up truck.



We also continued our regular operation at Harwich Port. The team checked over 100 trucks and multiple items of plant and vehicles.

Working with officers from the National Construction and Agricultural Theft Team (NCATT) two large earth movers were detained for further checks after serial numbers were found to have been removed.





## FOCUS ON DOGS

Two dog owner engagement events were held in Colchester and Tendring.

The team deal with live stock worrying, wildlife attacks and stolen dogs.



Officers attend popular dog walking sites across Essex and engage with owners, encouraging responsible ownership and offering free microchip checks on pets.

RET have carried 12 presentations and visits to various community and industry groups during February.

We were pleased to attend a joint meeting of Maldon farmers with the NFU.

Most fun was a visit to Mountnessing Primary School



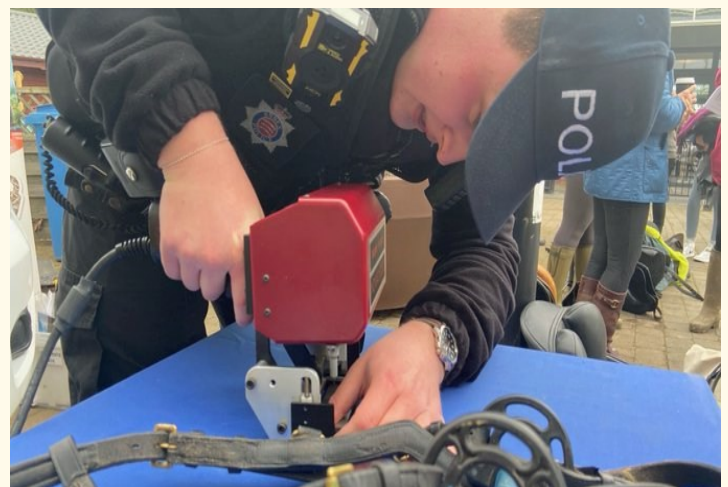
## PROPERTY MARKING

RET have recently obtained a property etching machine to help tackle theft and ensure recovered items can be returned to owners.

The machine can etch any surface including metal, plastic and leather.

The team spent the day marking horse riding equipment at Broomfields Equestrian & Country Store in Earls Colne.

Over 70 saddles and other items were marked. The machine will be used throughout the year.





## FARM SEARCHED

Our wildlife crime officer, PC Raven led an operation at an Essex farm following several poisoning incidents involving birds of prey.

We teamed up with Natural England, the Health and Safety Executive and the National Wildlife Crime Unit to search the farm for evidence of poisoning.

Several offences were uncovered, including an unlicensed firearm.



Enquiries continue with all agencies working together to deal with this matter.

We also carried out speed checks in Abberton and Aldham in Colchester, as well as White Roding in Uttlesford.

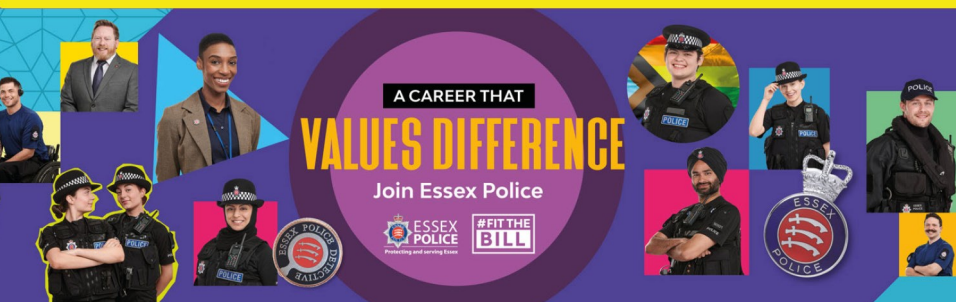
